CURRENCY AND CREDIT CARDS

The Polish Złoty (PLN) is the currency of Poland. One Zloty can be divided into 100 smaller units that are called grosz (abbreviated to gr). Coins consist of 1 gr, 2 gr, 5 gr, 10 gr, 50 gr, 1 pln, 2 pln and 5 pln. Note denominations are 10 pln, 20 pln, 50 pln, 100 pln, 200 pln and 500 pln.

Exchange rate at time of printing: 1 USD = \sim 3,8 PLN, 1 EUR = \sim 4,2 PLN.

The Polish Złoty is fully convertible and its rate of exchange depends on the current state of the exchange market. Banks are the easiest places you can find, to get Poland's money. You will exchange there practically any of the world's currencies.

Since the money market is free, individual banks, Forex businesses, currency exchange bureaus and hotel reception desks also can buy and sell złoty. VISA and MasterCard are accepted at the congress registration desk. Personal or company cheques are not accepted at the registration desk.

TIPPING

Tipping in Poland isn't required, but it is customary to leave a little extra for great service. The norm is to tip around 10% of the bill. You can tip 15% if the service was exceptionally good.


PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN KRAKÓW
